**Pastoral Ponderings**

Last Sunday we had a beautiful First Communion Mass, and fortunately the skies cleared up for us. I sat in front of the children and had a 'dialogue homily' with them, and they were so engaged and attentive: I was very proud of them.  
But the real listeners are the parents and visitors. I am quite aware that there are those who are not very strong in their Faith, and those who do not share our beliefs at all, and I do pitch some of my comments at them.  
I think Our Lord must have done the same. After all, we know there were children present at many of his gatherings: the Gospels tell us that on a few occasions, he called children to him and used them as examples for the adults. So I try to do the same.  
It is my constant prayer after First Communion that the parents themselves might 'catch the spark' of Eucharistic fire, and be more faithful and fervent in their Mass attendance, to set a good example for their children. Please join me in praying especially for this intention.

We live-stream not only the Saturday 4.30pm Mass, but also First Friday and First Saturday Masses, and important feasts that fall on weekdays.

This past Thursday was the feast of the Nativity of St John the Baptist. I texted our parishioner **Lien Duong**, who is stuck in Vietnam, so she could watch our Mass. She texted back:

Thank you for letting us know just in the nick of time. We're in the strictest lockdown ever: all public transportation including cabs and hire cars are banned. It's so nice that our whole family can watch the weekday Mass together - so there is something good coming out of this!

Last week I had an echo cardiogram, which turned out very well. My heart hasn't changed much since my last echogram in 2013, which was fine then.

I will see my GP this week to discuss those results along with some blood and urine tests done to check the salt levels. Then on Friday 9th July I'll go to St John of God Hospital in Subiaco for injections in four places in my spine.

Thank you, everyone, for your continual support and prayers. It is very encouraging to know that so many of you care about my welfare.

This weekend, the feast of two great Saints - Peter and Paul - who literally built the infant Church from scratch with their words, their work and their suffering, let's ask them to inspire us to build up our community of faith even more - and to begin the work of building new facilities for the future.
