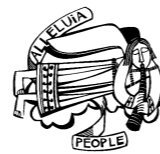

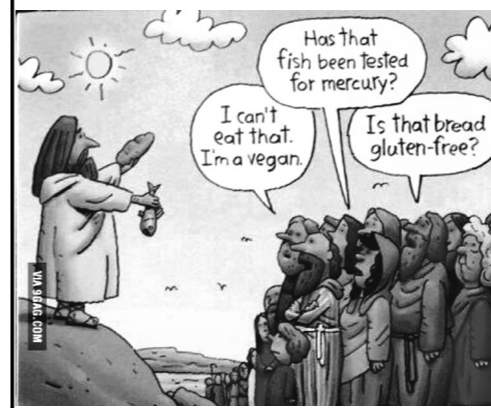
HOLY HOUR & ST JOSEPH DEVOTION

Pastoral Ponderings
I have been very pleased with the **parents** of our First Holy Communicants this year: they have been very good about attending both meetings, and have given their full attention to the material presented.

Now I am praying that the Spirit touches their hearts and brings all of them to Holy Mass, to give their children the best example possible: parents who approach the Lord's Table with devotion and humility, seeking to gain strength from the Bread of Life. Please pray for the parents and children.

Now that the retirement homes are loosening their regulations to allow more visitors, I am seeking some volunteers from among our Extraordinary Ministers of the Eucharist to bring **Communion** to the residents who cannot make it to Mass here in church or attend the Masses that I and Fr Mariusz offer at Acacia (RSL) and Elimatta homes.

Since the EMHCs are not administering the Chalice at present due to COVID restrictions, this would be a good way to exercise their Eucharistic ministry. I would like to have several teams, to share the load: two people per week at Acacia, and two people once a month (usually First Wednesday) at Elimatta. If you can help, please contact me or Fr Mariusz.

This coming Saturday is the feast of **Saint Rita of Cascia**. She is extremely popular in many places, particularly Italy. For nine years I taught at St Rita of Cascia High School in Chicago, and I was the Director of the National Shrine of St Rita - so she is very dear to me.

We will have Mass in her honour this Saturday, 22nd May, at 10.00am, with the traditional Blessing of Roses. If you'd like a blessed rose, it is very important to sign up on the list in the porch no later than this Thursday evening.

My health report: The earliest I can see the pain doctor is 17th June. So I'll have to depend upon various medications to help me cope with the pain. Then the doctor can determine whether I can benefit from possible nerve root injections; knee or hip replacement is on hold until the back pain sorted.

Please continue to pray for me; the pain is no fun.

I'm very pleased that our **new locks** have finally been installed (although at a high cost). From now on, the side door of the church will be unlocked but closed - you can simply turn the door handle to enter, and then close the door behind you. This will deter 'visitors' from coming in to pilfer the poor box or other receptacles for your donations. Thank you!
