

LENTEN NEWS FROM ST PAUL'S PARISH

Dear Parishioners

Lent is coming...actually it commences this week on Ash Wednesday! As we Catholics know, it's a time of solemn observance and preparation for the death and resurrection of Jesus at Easter. The season of Lent invites us to deepen our relationship with Jesus, opening up our hearts and minds to be ready to receive him and celebrate his life, death and resurrection more fully.

The pandemic continues to be a 'faith journey' for the parish, as we navigate the restrictions and separation from loved ones interstate and around the world.

In my Christmas newsletter, I said I felt very confident that we were well prepared to stay connected virtually, should we need to have any future lock down periods in WA. Little did I know that we would be putting it into practice as soon as February, and that it would be part of our Lenten sacrifice again in 2021!

The **live-streaming** equipment that was installed in the church in late March 2020, has proven to be a great asset to our parish, ensuring that all those who wish to stay connected and access all the services available in the parish, can do so. Live-streaming has been particularly useful in our recent lock-down experience in WA, with many people (particularly the vulnerable and elderly) staying home and joining us online. A big thank-you to our many parishioners who volunteer in the many ministries that keep our parish operating so smoothly: acolytes, altar servers, readers, IT, bookings/ushers and of course, Alessio & Theodore for providing beautiful music. They have been true champions!

However we can always do with more volunteers, and this may be something you've

Easing of Restrictions - Return to Phase 4 (COVID-19)

As we return to Phase 4 this week, following a transition out of lockdown, a refresher on the practices that we need to keep up in the parish:

- Contact registers are mandatory in the Church. We have both the SafeWA QR
 codes and the manual register in the foyer of the church. EVERY attendee/person
 in the family MUST be registered, not just one person in the family. This is required
 regardless of whether you are booked in for a service.
- 2 square metre rule (which determines the capacity in venues). We manage this by using every second pew, and maintaining 1.5mtrs between family groups. The exception is for seated and ticketed performances at places of worship, which means we can increase our capacity to busy services when required (eg Christmas and Easter services).
- As we have transitioned into Phase 4, we no longer need to book in for Mass <u>for regular</u> mid-week or weekend Mass services. But we do need to continue to social distance, use the hand sanitiser, dispose of weekly Bulletins (not put them back), no sign of peace, no collections during the Mass etc.

And now for some important announcements of upcoming Lenten and Easter events:

Lenten Program at St Paul's

Our church is normally packed to the rafters for Lenten and Easter events . . . but not this year. As a place of worship, it's very important that we demonstrate our adherence to the Government guidelines on social distancing and maximum capacity levels. It's also important our parishioners can be proud that we are upholding the protocols appropriately,

and feel confident to come and worship at St Paul's safely.

We have a busy Lenten program offered at St Paul's to assist people in their preparation for Easter and I'd like to invite you to participate in as many as you can.

You may recall that we were not able to attend Lenten or Easter services last year, so we are already in a better position than last year!

Reserve your seat

In our parish, we are managing the capacity of high attendance Masses/Services by **booking allocated seats** (by pew and seat number) for each of the major Lenten and Easter events, so we know when we are at capacity. These services are all listed below.

Booking allocated seats actually enables us to have a greater number of people attend in person, whilst maintaining the social distancing protocols. Without booking, we can only accommodate one-half of our seating capacity; but by booking allocated seats, we can accommodate two-thirds of our capacity. For the booked seating services, every second pew will be used, and each pew will contain 7 people (just like Christmas Mass).

Ash Wednesday Mass: 17th February – 5.45pm

If you are attending in person, please book an allocated seat in the church; alternatively, the service will be live-streamed on the night.

Friday (wk 1-6) evening Mass, Stations of the Cross and Benediction – 5.45pm

If you are attending in person, please book an allocated seat in the church; alternatively, the service will be live-streamed on the night.

Reconciliation: 25 March, 6.30pm

A number of priests will be available for confessions, beginning immediately after the 5.45pm Mass that evening. There will be no communal service – simply come to church, take a sheet with the examination of conscience and method of confession, and then approach one of the priests to receive the Sacrament of Penance. You are free to leave when you finish.

Booking link: No seat booking is required.
