Pastoral Ponderings

Last Thursday morning, our school children came to church for our annual May Crowning service. We had a short scripture service during which I gave a homily on Mary, our wise Mother.
 This was followed by the crowning of Our Lady's statue to the strains of the beloved hymn, "Bring Flow'rs of the Rarest".
 Then we all prayed the Glorious Mysteries of the Rosary, with various classes leading the decades. The liturgy concluded with solemn Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament, celebrated by Fr Mariusz.

One of our new teachers who came to us from another school commented, "I have never seen anything so sacred done in a school!" I am fortunate that our school administrators and staff give their complete cooperation and support in the religious program I have put into place: weekly Mass, weekly prayer services in the classroom, confessions each term, Stations of the Cross and Benediction in Lent, May Crowning and Benediction in May, conferral of the Brown Scapular in July, and our wonderful program of preparation for the sacraments of First Reconciliation, First Holy Communion and Confirmation.

Last week, our First Holy Communion children had a wonderful day with Sister Lisette at the Shrine of Our Lady of Schoenstatt in Armadale. As you see in today's bulletin, they will visit the Perth Synagogue this week to learn about our Jewish roots.
 Not every Catholic school in Perth offers such a thorough and truly Catholic religious program. In fact, I would wager that we are the only school that provides such a strong Catholic foundation. Let's give thanks to God that we can hand on the Faith to our children and grandchildren so well.

And we try to support our adults in their growth in faith as well: prayer groups, bible study, RCIA - these are important opportunities to increase our understanding of the scriptures and Church history and teaching. I am pleased that we always have people attending these sessions.

And, although we aren't using the undercroft now, it is good to see people coming to the Presbytery veranda for coffee and a chat. Plus, I get leftovers!

All of this activity flows from the life of the Blessed Trinity. Our God lives as three Divine Persons Who share life and love together. When we join in groups to pray, to study and to enjoy one another's company, we are living the life of the Trinity.
