Of course, all last week Father Mariusz and I 'held the fort' - he offered the Masses, while I operated the cameras and PowerPoint slides, and added some singing, plus homilies on two of the days.

Father and I took pride in knowing that we were offering you (and so many people outside the parish) a quality 'product' with - as usual - beautiful slides to provide you with the Mass texts, photos and art work, and illustrations for the homilies.
