
The Wisdom of the Saints: Mary's Dormition and Assumption

Pastoral Ponderings

It's unfortunate that we're limited to the three Mass readings printed on our bulletin cover, because there are also three additional readings provided for the Vigil Mass, and they lead into the readings for the actual feast, which falls on Sunday this year.

The First Reading of the Vigil is about David bringing the Ark of the Covenant to a suburb of Jerusalem, where he had prepared a beautiful tent in which to house it. David, of course, wanted to build a magnificent Temple for the Ark, but because of his adultery with Bathsheba, God passed that privilege on to David & Bathsheba's son, Solomon.

The Ark was that chest made of cedar and plated in gold, topped by figures of two winged cherubim and able to be transported during the Israelites' journey through the desert by being carried on the shoulders of Levites - Temple assistants - with poles that slipped through rings attached to the Ark.

Within the Ark were kept the original stone tablets of the Ten Commandments - the Ten Words, as the Jews call them (or, in Greek, Decalogue). There was also a bowl of the miraculous Manna, the bread from Heaven that had sustained the Israelites in their passage from Egypt to the Promised Land.

Today's First Reading emphasises that Mary is now that Ark - no longer a chest of wood and gold, but a container of flesh and blood who contained within herself the living Word of God and Bread from Heaven: Jesus, the eternal Son of God.

Thank you for your generous contributions last weekend. But we're not out of the financial woods yet: we're still about \$5,500 in the hole. As I wrote last weekend, it's just a fact of life that 01 July brings with it a variety of bills that suddenly appear: the Archdiocesan tax (assessment), our BAS, insurance, City of Stirling rates, flowers, lawn keeping expenses. And weekly contributions don't suddenly quadruple to meet these expenses! So please do what you can. On behalf of the entire parish, am grateful to you for your sacrificial giving.

And that's the key word: sacrificial giving. I will contribute \$5,000.00 of my own annual stipend of \$12,000.00 to help the parish get into the black (Heck, I ain't goin' nowhere soon - I'm stuck here and can't go home to visit my family. \$5,000.00 is what I would normally pay for plane tickets, hotels & food during my annual trip home, so there's no use sitting on it, and the parish needs to get on a solid financial footing quickly.

I don't want to ask you to do what I'm not willing to do myself. So please do what you can - every little bit will help - and then we can move forward.
