The Wisdom of the Saints: The Eucharist

Today my soul is greater than the entire world, because it possesses You - You Whom Heaven and earth cannot contain. - St Margaret of Cortona
Reflect on this Eucharistic Mystery and say to yourself, "It is God Almighty Who will come down upon the altar at the words of Consecration. I shall hold Him in my hands, and receive Him into my heart, and speak to Him there." Surely such an expression of love should be enough to awaken anyone from the slumber of indifference. - St John of Avila
If as often as the Lord's Blood is offered at the altar, it is poured forth for the remission of sins, ought I not to receive it always, so that my sins may always be forgiven? After all, I am always committing sin, so I ought always to have a remedy. - St Ambrose of Milan
Jesus Christ found a way by which He could ascend into Heaven and yet remain on the earth: He instituted the adorable Sacrament of the Eucharist, so that He might stay with us and be the Food of our soul, that He might stay with us and be our Companion. - St John Vianney
Our Lord does not come from Heaven every day to stay in a golden ciborium - no, He comes to find another Heaven: the Heaven of our soul, in which He loves to dwell. - St Therese of Lisieux

Pastoral Ponderings



During the Mass, when the priest pronounces the words of Eucharistic consecration, "This is My Body . . . This is My Blood", the underlying reality of the bread and wine - their essential substance - change into the Body and Blood of Christ, given for us in sacrifice. Christ Himself is really, actually and substantially present, in a mysterious way, under the appearances of bread and wine.
The Greek word eucharist means thanksgiving, and the description of Christ's action at the Last Supper that we hear at every Mass tells us that He gave thanks to the Father before He broke the bread. And so we, too, give thanks after we receive Holy Communion. Returning to our places, we take some moments of silent reflection to thank the Lord for what He has given us in life. And we realise that each time we receive Holy Communion we are fortifying ourselves to live our lives in such a way that we will always be prepared for the call to leave this world.

Jesus says, He who eats My Flesh and drinks My Blood has eternal life, and I will raise him up on the Last Day. A good way to expand our Eucharistic awareness and grow in devotion is to make a visit to the Blessed Sacrament. This can be done during the day whenever we can visit a Catholic church, where the Lord awaits us in the Tabernacle.

All we have to do is kneel or sit quietly, put aside our cares and activities aside for a moment, and say, "Lord, here I am." And then just give the Lord the simply gift of your presence. That's all. No big words are necessary - He just enjoys your presence.

But another way to grow in Eucharistic faith is to come to adore Him during our Wednesday evening Holy Hour, 6.15 - 7.15pm. You can pray, read a bit of a spiritual book, and then just quietly bask in the Sunshine of God's love. You can stay for a few minutes, or for the entire hour - it's up to you.
