Pastoral Ponderings

This past Tuesday I went to the WA Museum Boola Bardip to see a special exhibition from the British Museum: Ancient Greeks - Athletes, Warriors and Heroes.

From the sporting triumphs of the original Olympians to the conquests of Alexander the Great and epic tales of Homer, Greek history is filled with the glorious deeds of athletes, warriors and heroes.

I was greatly impressed by the wonderful way in which not only this exhibition, but all the exhibits of the Museum, were presented. What a wonderful addition to the City of Perth this refurbished and rebuilt Museum is! I highly recommend that you visit it, and take your children or grandchildren; it would be a wonderful outing, especially during the upcoming school holidays. (There is also a café and a large gift shop!)

My own dad instilled in me a love of reading. He required me and my younger brothers to go to the public library every other Saturday morning (after the obligatory TV cartoons!) and choose two books to read at home. One had to be something about history, while the other could be anything we chose - however, we had to present our books to Dad for approval; sometimes he made us return a book and exchange it for something more suitable.

I developed a love for history, and later on I did my second major in university in social studies (the first was the obligatory major in philosophy).

Many times, my second-choice of a book was some kind of mythology: Egyptian, Greek, Roman, Norse. I knew all about Thor and Loki long before the films came out! So this special Museum exhibition drew my attention, and I'm really glad I saw it.

Our parish cantor, **Theodore Murphy-Jelley**, went to the Museum with me. Theo is in his sixth year of singing for us at St Paul's, but next weekend will be his last (for a while, at least): he leaves on Tuesday 14th September for Manchester UK, where he will embark on a two-year course of study toward his second master's degree, this one in music performance.

Some parishioners had wanted Theo to provide us with a farewell concert of 'old favourites', but he would rather give us a recital of new music he will learn in the UK, when he returns. He hopes this will be over the Christmas holidays, but given the difficulty of travel, we'll see. (He had to secure a Government exemption to leave Australia, and we don't know what the scenario will be as time goes on. But we live in hope.) We'll all miss Theodore.
