# Pastoral Ponderings

We all know today's Gospel story about the man who sincerely wants to follow Jesus, but in the end decides not to do so, because Jesus wants him to give up all his possessions - and the Gospel tells us that 'he was a man of great wealth.'

Does Our Lord really want us to give up all that we have and own in order to be His disciples?

He does ask this of some. There are those who have literally given up their homes, possessions and income in order to follow Jesus. St Francis of Assisi whose feast we celebrated on 4th October is one. When he died, he wanted to be naked - stripped of any clothing - and lying on the bare dirt - devoid of any dwelling. He literally lived, and died, having given up all things to follow Jesus.

\* \* \* \* :

Today, members of religious orders, to one degree or another, give up quite a bit in order to follow Jesus by living the Gospel counsel of poverty. Of course, they share a community dwelling, and they have clothing - those who wear a religious habit can more easily live the vow of poverty than those who choose to wear secular clothing - they have to go shopping for clothes, and have a variety of things to wear. It can be problematic.

But most religious men and women - educated and professionally trained in most cases - turn in their salary to the community and accept whatever the community gives them in terms of a room, food, etc. It is a modified form of following Jesus' advice to leave all things in order to follow Him.

Diocesan priests like me and Father Mariusz don't take a vow of poverty; many people are surprised to learn this. We're not monks or religious - we live and work in the world, so we are sometimes called 'secular priests' as opposed to 'order priests'.

Nevertheless, we give up quite a bit in order to follow Christ in our vocation. For example: I have two bachelor degrees, two master degrees and a doctorate, plus a teaching diploma (social studies, years 6 - 12) and professional certification in prison and hospital chaplaincy. I could make a good living in the world with a professional position, teaching in a university or working in a hospital or prison.

But I work for you. I live in a very modest home, which I do not own, and I have a monthly stipend of \$1,000.00. Yes, I get some additional funds in terms of Mass or baptism stipends, but I receive nowhere the amount I could make in a secular job. I do this in response to Jesus' call to follow Him.

What about you? Your donations to the Church, and your charity to the needy, are ways for you to express your discipleship. How are you doing?
