We have wages (\$1,600), BAS (\$2,000), our Archdiocesan tax - \$1,000) the monthly underground power debt (that's \$500 every single month for five years). It's a lot, and we don't have enough.

I try not to focus on this, although the secretary never lets me forget! My theory is always this: if I work hard to provide you with uplifting worship, good spiritual support and strong teaching, you in turn will support the parish. And, in the end, you always come through - although it's usually touchand-go each month! But I don't lose sleep over it.


I also believe that if we generously support the poor, through Project Compassion, Mission Sunday and other such special donations, God will in return bless us - the parish and also your families - with all that we need. He has never let me down.

We had a good start to bible study and RCIA this past week. Please consider coming to one or more sessions of either program. It's a wonderful way to grow in knowledge, expand your faith horizons, and share fellowship with parishioners.

I just received on Thursday the finalised drawings of the exteriors of our new parish buildings. I'll present them to the entire parish soon. Exciting!
