**Pastoral Ponderings**

Last Wednesday we celebrated with a sung Mass the 64<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the dedication of our church in 1957.

And this Wednesday we commemorate the 42<sup>nd</sup> anniversary of our second parish priest: **Msgr Thomas Lenihan** (with a Mass at Elimatta Home that morning). He succeeded **Msgr John Wallace**, who organised the parish and built the church and presbytery, but then went on to another parish.

Msgr Lenihan found the church to be too small for the quickly-growing community; so he added the sanctuary and sacristy, the undercroft, and the porch. He was a builder, and could usually be found in the shed behind the presbytery, tinkering away on some project. Then he, too, moved on after being at St Paul's for only four years. But to these first two priests we owe a huge debt: they rallied the troops and built the facilities we have enjoyed for the past 64 years.

\* \* \* \* \*

The Book of Ecclesiasticus tells us that 'there is a time to tear down, and a time to build again'. That time is almost upon us. In a few weeks, I'll present to you the beautiful drawings of what our new church, presbytery/parish centre and school annexe will look like.

And just as the people built the present church and presbytery very quickly - within a year - so I hope to complete our new facilities very quickly - within five or six years. My predecessors didn't have to deal with building codes and council permit like I do (and with some obvious results: steep stairs all over the place, flooding, cracking foundation, etc. But what the heck: we've gotten 64 years of use from buildings that were intended to last only 50!

\* \* \* \* \*

Those of you who made the initial pledges in our **Building Pledge Program** before the pandemic hit will receive within a few days a letter from me about this. Please get back to me about this soon.

Those of you who are new to the parish, and those who are 'veterans': I ask you to consider making a pledge. We will soon ask the Archdiocese to give us a loan for the construction of the new parish centre and presbytery - about two million dollars. I need to show the Archdiocese that we are able to pay off this loan within twenty years.

Given the fact that several years ago we paid off a quarter-million-dollar loan to replace the church roof - and did it within 30 months - I have complete confidence in your financial and moral support for our new buildings.

There's no way around this: we have to replace the buildings, which are literally falling to pieces around us. Please help; I'm counting on you.
