The Wisdom of the Saints: Purgatory

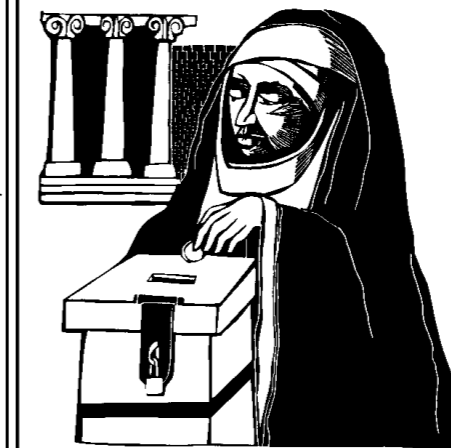
We must say many prayers for the souls of the faithful departed, for one must be very pure to enter Heaven.

Pastoral Ponderings

It's an important annual spiritual exercise for me to inscribe the names of your beloved departed family members and friends into our parish **Book of Remembrance**, and to keep adding names as they are given to me on this month of the Holy Souls.

And I hope it's a good spiritual exercise for you, too. Someone once proposed this to me: "Why don't we just type up all the names of those we want remembered at Mass, and then you (Father) keep the lists and just reprint them each year - with any new additions, of course."

Yes, that would be the pragmatic approach. But, as I said, it is an important spiritual exercise to sit down and write down the names each year - because it involves remembering on your part.

As the names and faces pass before the eyes of our mind, the memories surface, and the people become real to us again, if for but a moment. These are people to whom we are grateful, perhaps; or they are people still in need of our forgiveness, perhaps.

Above all, they are people crying out to us for a remembrance in our prayers. They can no longer pray for themselves - they are completely dependent upon our prayers. So it's good to name them, and then pray for them.

I was so pleased to see the **great attendance** at Mass for both All Saints Day on Monday (75) and All Souls Day on Tuesday (135 in the evening, plus 21 at the student Mass in the morning).

I have not changed the **Wisdom of the Saints** quotes (above) because they are about Purgatory, and we all need to remember that the Holy Souls in Purgatory are completely dependent upon our kind prayers.

During this month of November, try to make a visit to the Blessed Sacrament (enter church through the side door). Page through the Book of Remembrance. Light a candle. Kneel or sit in the silence, and spend some quiet moments with Jesus.

Wherever Our Lord is present in the Most Blessed Sacrament in the Tabernacle, the Angels and Saints are also present, adoring Him.

And the souls of your departed family members and friends are also here in church, united in the Communion of Saints: those in Heaven, those in Purgatory and us on Earth, all praising God and asking Him for His love and mercy.

So take a moment now, and re-read the quotes from the **Wisdom of the Saints** above. One day WE will be among the Holy Souls in Purgatory! Hopefully there will be family members and friends praying for US. In the meantime, pray for the faithful departed.
