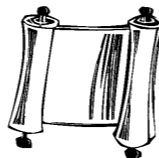

There was a time not too long ago when Catholics were the minority Christian group in Australia. Now we are on the top - but that brings a special responsibility: to proclaim Christ to the nation by the quality of our lives.

If we are going to live authentic Christian lives, we must be guided by God's word in Scripture. So here are six quick tips for effectively reading God's word:

1) **Ask God for direction.** Before you open your bible, begin with a simple prayer asking God to take the wheel and direct your time in His word to reap the greatest blessing for you, and for His greater glory on earth.

2) **Consider your struggles, joys and needs.** Take a moment to ask God to bring to mind anything you've been struggling with, praying about, or even praising Him for. You'll be amazed how you may then turn directly to a passage that jumps off the page and directly addresses your needs.

3) **Start with just one verse.** Look up the daily verse on a bible app (e.g. Biblegateway.com, but there are many options available out there!) and turn to that verse in your bible. This may force you into places in God's Word you may not be inclined to visit and study. It's a great place to get started!

4) **Use a devotional.** The parish provides such devotionals for Advent/Christmas, and Lent/Easter; but these are simply guides TO scripture, not a replacement FOR scripture. If you use a devotional allow it to guide you to a scripture text, but then turn to your bible and read it there. You may be led to read further!

5) **Chunk it up!** Don't get overwhelmed, or get sidetracked or bored when you're reading the Bible. Simply 'chunk it up': read small bits and pieces. Pray and ask the Holy Spirit to lead you to a short passage. Read it, then read it again. Then, pray.

6) **Use SOAP!** Scripture: Choose a text, and read it slowly. Observation: What struck you about this text? Application: What is God saying to you? Prayer: Ask God to help you apply this text to your life. Hurray - you're reading the bible prayerfully!
