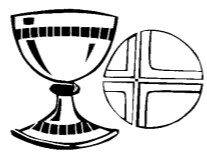

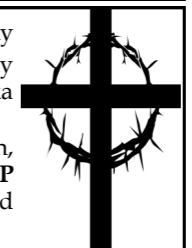

If you weren't here last weekend, please consider participating in the **National Church Life Survey (NCLS) 2022**. The NCLS was established in 1991 to track the life of Christian churches in Australia, and it's the largest study of church life in the world! It's held every five years alongside the National Census, and it involves more than 20 Christian denominations.

Results are sent to each parish to inform leaders about the composition and participation of their congregation, help formulate strategies to respond to social changes, and plan effectively to serve their congregation's needs. You can use either the **paper survey** received here, or complete the **online form**. Instructions are in the middle column on this page.
