



Pastoral Ponderings

Have you completed and returned (or completed electronically) your National Church Life Survey (NCLS) 2022? I hope so - I'm really looking forward to receiving the results, which will compare us to thousands of other Christian churches in this country, help formulate strategies to respond to social changes, and plan effectively to serve our congregation's needs.

A big thank you to Father Mariusz and Lilian Bellandi for organising the survey for our parish.

Parishioner Albert Biagioni has submitted our Application for Demolition to the City of Stirling; hopefully they'll accept it, and permit us to tear down the Presbytery and begin construction of our new Parish Centre/Presbytery.

But before we can demolish, we need to:

- rent a large walk-in storage unit in the area
- move the things in the shed, and some things from the Presbytery, to storage in this unit
- move the office furniture, photocopier, etc. to the temporary office generously being provided by parishioner Suellen Horgan in the granny flat behind her home in Rookwood Street (which will be very convenient - between the church and school!)

- move me to a new living accommodation.

too far away where I can live for the next two or three years while we construct the new Presbytery/ Parish Centre.

One option is for the parish to rent a unit at one of the retirement homes in Alexander Drive. Various

Another option is to rent or purchase a unit in one of the apartment complexes in the area. I wouldn't want to live too far away from the church, though.

A third option is for someone or a group to purchase a unit where I can live, and then rent it out or sell it after I move into the new Presbytery.

I would probably need a two-bedroom unit, so could set up a study in one bedroom. At Suellen's granny flat there is a large front room, which will contain the main parish office furnishings and equipment. A small rear room can serve as an office for meetings for baptismal and marriage prep counselling, etc. But it's not large enough for me to live in - no real kitchen, only the one bathroom, etc.

So I will need a separate residence, and a place where I can work in the evenings (like now - it's Thursday at 10.10pm as I write this!).

If you have any connections with (a) storage unit facilities or (b) real estate agencies in the area, please get in touch with me. It will be time for us to 'get down to business' sooner than we realise.
