WHY PANCAKES ON SHROVE TUESDAY?

Lent used to be much stricter: no one ate meat or any dairy products (incl. milk, butter, eggs & cheese). On the day before Lent began, the people cleaned their cupboards & larders of these foods and made pancakes (& sausages!) for their last big meal before Ash Wednesday. Also on this Tuesday, the people would all go to confession, to be 'shriven' (forgiven) of their sins. The priest 'shrove' (forgave) them their sins - so the day is called Shrove Tuesday to this day. *A good idea - have your pancakes, but go to confession this week, too!*

Pastoral Ponderings

Ash Wednesday, the start of the holy season of Lent, is upon us! For all of us, young and old alike, Lent is an opportunity for us to make small sacrifices each day:

- ◆ a sacrifice of time, to enable us to pray & think
- ◆ a sacrifice of appetite, to discipline our will
- ◆ a sacrifice of treasure, to make room for others.

Check out the box above, which gives us reflections of some of the Saints on the concept of sacrifice.

'Sacrifice' in Latin actually means 'make sacred'; it doesn't mean giving things up. Yet we don't become holy people by indulging ourselves, always putting ourselves first.

No, we become holy by following Jesus' advice: love God, love our neighbour, love ourselves - in that order. And this kind of love often requires some sacrifice.

As you read this in church, you have made a small sacrifice of time to be at Mass. We call Mass 'the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass' precisely because it sets before us, over and over again, the once-for-all yet ongoing Sacrifice of Our Lord on the Cross.

Lent begins on Ash Wednesday: what sacrifices will we make to follow Jesus' three-part program of spiritual renewal - prayer, fasting and almsgiving?

As you leave Mass today, you can take a copy of the booklet Remember (one per household), to assist you in growing spiritually this Lent. Unite yourself to Christ in His Sacrificial death for the world.
