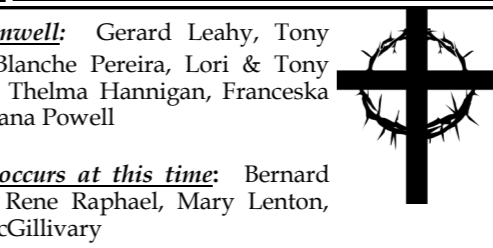
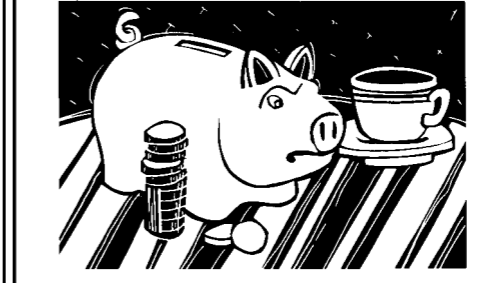

Pastoral Ponderings

We had wonderful attendance at our two Masses for Ash Wednesday. Thank you for faithfully coming together to begin Lent as a community.

Speaking of attendance: new COVID regulations permit us to have up to 150 people at Mass, keeping proper social distancing. If we were to completely fill every other pew, that would be 125 people - but since we maintain some social distance within the permitted pews, we actually have fewer than 125 people at Mass. So we're following regulations!

Congratulations on your splendid cooperation with the regulations throughout the pandemic. I hope we are nearing the end of this, and will soon be able to return to normal seating in church.

Unfortunately, the regulations have impacted our ability to have groups of more than 15 in the undercroft, which means we won't have bible study for at least the next few weeks, although we can continue to have RCIA as usual in the undercroft.

And because our cuppa after the Rosary is held on the Presbytery veranda, which is outdoors, we can go on having that as well.

I already know that Elimatta is not an option; Acacia has openings from time to time, but none at present. Perhaps one of the Catholic homes has an opening, but they are farther away, and I'd like to be close to the church.
