To me, the Cross is certain salvation. The Cross is that which I ever venerate. The Cross of the Lord is with me. The Cross is my refuge. - St Thomas Aquinas

Be like a shopkeeper dealing with his merchandise: he makes a profit on every item. So don't allow the smallest fragment of your crosses to be wasted. Your cross today may be the sting of an insect or the prick of a needle that annoys you. It may be the little eccentricities of a neighbour, or some unintentional slight, the insignificant loss of a coin, some little restlessness of your soul, a slight physical weakness, a pain in your limbs. Whatever it may be, make a profit on every bit of your crosses., as the shopkeeper does, and you will soon be wealthy in God. - St Louis Marie Grignon de Montfort

The Names of These Days

MAUNDY THURSDAY
'Maundy' is an Old English corruption of the Latin word *mandatum*, 'commandment'. In the Gospel for Holy Thursday Mass, Jesus says: *I give you a new commandment: love one another as I have loved you.*

It was the custom in medieval England to give food & clothing to the poor on this day. In our time, The Queen visits a cathedral in England and gives small velvet bags filled with specially minted *Maundy* coins to some pensioners and other needy folks.

GOOD FRIDAY
Painful as it was for Our Lord, it was **good** for us that He died for our salvation. This act of Divine Mercy enabled us to access His grace on earth - and in the end, Heaven.

Pastoral Ponderings

Some people ask me this every year: *What should we do with our blessed palm or olive branch?*

Don't throw it away! Take it home and place it behind a crucifix or picture at home as a reminder that Christ is King of your family. Let it be a visible sign of your faith - and it's an excellent conversation starter!

I ask each one of you to do your best to attend at least one of this week's special Holy Week liturgies, our most beautiful and profound celebrations of the year. Don't just show up on Easter Sunday - try to enter into the spirit of Holy Week by being with the community as we walk with Jesus from the Last Supper in the Upper Room to the Garden of Olives, from the Garden of Olives to the High Priest's house, from that house to the Praetorium of Pontius Pilate, from the Praetorium to Mount Calvary, and from Calvary to the Holy Sepulchre.

I'm pleased that more and more people, who have already attended the Stations of the Cross and/or the Solemn 3.00pm Liturgy on Good Friday (many come to both), are discovering the sublime beauty of our Seven Last Words service at 7.30pm. It's short (20 minutes), very meditative (all in darkness), and hauntingly beautiful as we recall in Scripture, song and prayer the seven last statements Jesus made from the Cross as He was dying.

I will see each one of you at something this week. It's the holiest week of the year! This is our faith!
