Pastoral Ponderings

*This past Thursday morning we had our annual May Crowning in church. Due to Covid, with a number of the younger children infected, we had only the Year 4, 5 & 6 students participate in the liturgy.*

*It included the presentation of flowers, prayers, Scripture reading, homily, Rosary and Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament.*

*The students were very engaged, and each class took a turn leading the Rosary. A number of our parishioners attended, for which I am grateful.*

*But the younger children were not left out! They visited our Grotto of Our Lady, constructed three years ago just inside the entrance gates near the pre-primary classrooms.*

*They gathered in small groups to bring flowers to Our Lady and say a few prayers along with their teachers.*

\* \* \* \* \*

*It has been one of my priorities that we should hand on to our children the traditions of Catholic prayer and worship: Rosary, Stations of the Cross in Lent, and Benediction - in addition to the weekly Mass, plus weekly prayer services in the classrooms.*

*I'm so grateful that the school administrators and teachers have always been cooperative and very supportive.*

*But as we (teachers and priests) talk about these opportunities of prayer, it seems that St Paul's School offers the most to our students in terms of a wide variety of liturgical experiences.*

\* \* \* \* \*

*'Practice makes perfect' is the key. If the children are only attending Mass or other prayer services once or twice a quarter (as is the case in many schools), then they don't develop a familiarity with the prayers, hymns and rituals of our liturgy.*

*This means that every time the children are brought to church, it is a case of going 'back to square one', and then the focus is not on prayer, but on discipline and 'keeping the children quiet'.*

*Fortunately, because our school children have some form of liturgy and prayer every single week, they know not only how to behave, but they know all the words of our prayers, and they know many of our hymns, both traditional and modern.*

*The school aside, I am grateful to all our parish parents who so faithfully bring their children to Mass on the weekends. Yes, it's challenging at first; but 'practice makes perfect' - over a short period of time, the children settle down and become engaged in the liturgy with the rest of the community.*
