

This weekend we celebrate the Solemnity of the Lord's Ascension into Heaven. This feast was actually this past Thursday, the 40th day after Easter; but because everyone is working or in school, the feast is transferred to the next weekend so that everyone can celebrate and be inspired by it.

And it is inspiring, because it's not just about Our Lord's return to Heaven - it also reminds us that 'where He has gone, we hope to follow'. In other words, we are also destined to go to Heaven.

We make our way there in this life by our faithfu observance of the Commandments, our heartfelt worship together, our fervent prayer alone or with others, and especially by imitating the Lord Jesus in our reaching out to the poor, the sick, and the needy.

Mission Sunday is normally in October each year. But our Catholic Mission Office reached out to me and asked if we would host Cardinal Souraphiel, the Archbishop of Addis Abeba, during his tour of Australia. I right away said yes, and I hope I was speaking on your behalf.

His Eminence has been in Sydney, Melbourne and Brisbane. As I told you last weekend, he will be in Perth next weekend: Infant Jesus Parish in Morley for the Saturday evening Mass, the Cathedral in Perth for the Sunday evening Mass, and our little parish for the Sunday morning Mass.

This is an immense honour for our parish. It is the first time in our parish history that a Cardinal is going to offer Mass at our altar. I watched the livestream of his Mass in Sydney - he speaks English very well. He will tell us a bit about his country, where 70% of the people are Christian, and 30% are Muslim. Until recently, everyone got along well; but leave it to ISIS and the others to stir up trouble. The country has been in civil war for the past 18

Although Catholics are the minority Christian group (the Orthodox are the majority), it is the Catholic church that provides the country with many fine schools, hospitals, clinics and outreach to the poor. The Church is very respected for this.

In the pews this weekend are envelopes that you can use to make a contribution to the ministry of the Church in Ethiopia - by cash, cheque or credit card. I know you will be very generous. Thank you ir

I'll preach at the Saturday Masses next weekend, but I'll conduct the parish choir for the Mass which His Eminence will celebrate. A morning tea in the school hall will follow the Mass. Let's do the parish proud and give a warm welcome to our special guest
