## Pastoral Ponderings

From our parish history, <u>A People Gather</u>:

In September 1956 the parish was formally instituted, and Monsignor John Wallace was appointed parish priest. . . He decided that the parish would be under the patronage of St **Paul**. He felt this was appropriate for an area where so many Jewish families resided, St Paul having been such a devout follower of the Jewish tradition.

St Paul and the Jewish tradition are wonderfully illustrated in the quilt that hangs above our statue of the parish patron.

At the top are the two tablets of the Law (the Ten Commandments), with the Hebrew letters for the first word of each Commandment.

Below that is the famous Star of David, said to be the insignia of King David and his army, and now the emblem of the State of Israel.

Then there is a menorah, the golden sevenbranched menorah, the candelabrum that stood in the Holy Place in the Temple. When the Jewish people of Perth moved to the new northern suburbs, they laid out the first streets in the form of this candelabrum and named the suburb . . . Menora!

Finally there is St Paul's 'Sword of the Spirit', which he describes in Ephesians 6 as an essential part of the 'armour of God' with which each of us Christians must protect ourselves 'so that we can stand our ground when the day of evil comes.'

Everything is laid out upon a dark blue cross that isn't yet fully formed, a reminder of how our faith in Christ began with His Jewish roots. Through His Death on the Cross, He has led us 'out of darkness and into His own wonderful light'. Thus this quilt is dark in tone, but the Light of Christ is already beginning to spread outward to the whole world.

This tapestry, generously donated to the parish several years ago by Gordon & Patricia Coelho, was made to be a counterpart of the other quilt that hangs above the shrine of Our Lady of Perpetual

Made from fabric purchased in various places in Greece and Turkey by parishioners who went on a pilgrimage 'in the footsteps of St Paul' in 2007 to commemorate the 50th anniversary of our church, this tapestry depicts the Risen Christ appearing to Saul of Tarsus (later St Paul) in a burst of light on the road to Damascus.

On this feastday of our parish patron St Paul, let us ask him for his prayers from his place in Heaven, to bless all our undertakings, and to guide us in our journey 'out of darkness and into the Light.'
