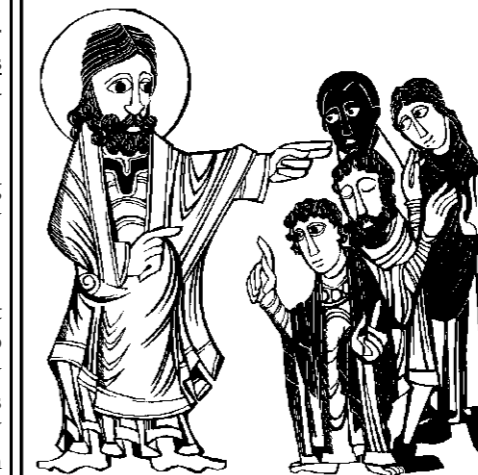

Pastoral Ponderings

It was a shame that Cardinal Souraphiel, the Archbishop of Addis Ababa, was afraid to come to our church last Sunday. He has weathered civil war in his own Ethiopia, and even a period of imprisonment for the Faith. But he certainly didn't expect to be accosted by a group of 9 or 10 Ethiopian 'toughs' outside our Cathedral last Saturday night after his Mass there.

Apparently he was dogged by a few protesters at his previous stops in Sydney, Melbourne, Brisbane and Canberra. But for some reason a larger group surrounded the Cardinal outside St Mary's after Mass as he was speaking to the people, and began loudly haranguing him. So some of the Cathedral parishioners brought His Eminence back inside the Cathedral - and the protesters followed him in and began shouting and threatening violence. So he was afraid to come to our church the next day, Sunday, lest these protesters try to interrupt our Mass.

Ethiopia is mostly Christian, but it has a sizeable 30% Muslim population. Catholics make up less than 2% of the people, but next to the State, the Catholic Church provides most of the schools, clinics and other social services, and the State is grateful for this.

However, the present civil war which has been ongoing for a number of years was stirred up by ISIS. Then other malcontents got on board, so there are several conflicting groups there.

The protesters want the Cardinal to condemn one of the groups as inflicting 'genocide' on their group. The Cardinal refuses to do this, lest his own small flock of Catholics experience more distress than they are already enduring.

He deals with protests all the time in Ethiopia, but he certainly didn't expect anything like that here in Perth. I was up late Saturday night trying to convince him to come to our Sunday 9.00am Mass, and when I finally went to sleep at 3.00am, I thought he had agreed to come.

But the next morning, our Director of Catholic Mission in Perth told me that the Cardinal had again decided it was best that he not come. It was very disappointing - but we had a magnificent Mass. The Choir was amazing, and Monsignor Entwistle did a great job filling in.

But in the end, the Cardinal did join us in the school hall for our sumptuous morning tea, so beautifully prepared by our good parishioners. Everyone was thrilled to meet him and speak with him. He blessed a number of rosaries (!), and had photos taken with various people. So, truly, all's well that ends well!
