


MARRIAGE MASS at the CATHEDRA;

Vanity of vanities: all is vanity! It is vanity (useless) to seek material wealth that cannot last, and to put your trust in it. It is also vanity to seek recognition and status.

It is vanity to chase after what the world says you should want, and to long for things you should not have, things for which you will have to pay a high price later on, if you get them.

It is vanity to wish for a long life, but to care little for a good life.

It is vanity to focus only on your present life, and not to look ahead to your future

It is vanity to live only for the joys of the moment, and not to eagerly seek the lasting joys that await you.

Make every effort to shift your focus from things you can see to the eternal things vou cannot see.

Pastoral Ponderings

You will have noticed that I am now including a short section of the spiritual classic, The Imitation of Christ, by Thomas à Kempis between 1418 and 1427 in the Netherlands. It was originally intended as a handbook for the movement called 'Devotio Moderna' (Modern Devotion).

This handbook was for the many lay people, and clergy as well, who could not leave their families and jobs to join the new religious orders that were springing up, like the Franciscans, Dominicans, Carmelites, Augustinians and Servites. Believe me, it was all the rage to become a friar or nun: by the time St Francis of Assisi died at the age of 44, there were more than 30,000 Franciscans in Europe!

But, realistically, most people are not called to leave home and join a religious order, as good as that vocation may be. (I myself was an Augustinian friar for 20 years before I left that Order and became a diocesan priest.)

The book is divided into four sections:

- Helpful Advice for Living a Spiritual Life - Directives for Developing an Interior Life
- Meditations on Interior Consolation
- Reflections on the Blessed Sacrament

The book emphasises the interior life of meditation and prayer that is possible for everyone, unlike the active apostolate practised by the friars.

It especially focusses on devotion to the Holy Eucharist as the key element of spiritual life.

The Imitation of Christ is perhaps the most widely read Christian devotional work after the Bible, and and is regarded as a devotional and religious classic.

Its popularity was immediate, and after the first printed edition in 1471-72, it was printed in 745 editions before 1650.

Apart from the Bible, no book had been translated into more languages than the Imitation of Christ at the time. It is still very good to read (in small bites, which is what I'm trying to provide for you here).

The book can be found in most good bookshops, and also is available online.

Staying on the theme of spiritual growth, we will have a retreat weekend at New Norcia for those who would like to join our parish group: Friday evening to Sunday lunch, December 9 - 11.

It's the only weekend we were able to secure, but we'll soon advertise another retreat for the first part of next year.
