The Wisdom of the Saints: Trust in Divine Providence



Pastoral Ponderings

It is a wonderful coincidence that we are studying the resurrection of the body in this week when we will celebrate the Assumption of Our Lady into

Indeed, this great feast is not only meant to give praise to God for Our Lady's being taken up into Heaven, but also to focus our minds and hearts on our belief in our own being taken up into Heaven on the Last Day.

When I am teaching our children, I ask them: What is the difference between Our Lord's Ascension into Heaven and Our Lady's Assumption into Heaven?

The difference is this: Jesus went up to Heaven, body and soul, on His own power as the Son of God, the Second Person of the Blessed Trinity. Mary however, had to be taken up into Heaven by God.

Likewise, the children learn this from me: when we die, our souls will go before God for our Particular Judgement. All of our thoughts, words and actions in this earthly life will be reviewed in the presence of Almighty God, and we will be assigned our place in eternity in Heaven, Purgatory or Hell, and there we will await the Final or Last Judgement.

Our bodies, meanwhile will remain here on earth, buried, cremated or buried at sea. Time will pass, perspective, because there can be discord and one day there will be the long-awaited Second
