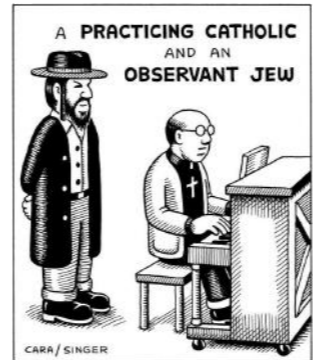

A Short Meditation  
 from The Imitation of Christ  
 by Thomas a Kempis (1379-1471)

This is the greatest and the most useful lesson we can learn: to know ourselves for what we truly are, to admit freely our weaknesses and failings, and to hold a humble opinion of ourselves because of them.  
 Not to dwell on ourselves, and always to think well and highly of others, is great wisdom and spiritual perfection.  
 If you should see another person sin openly, or commit some grave wrong, still you should not think yourself a better person, for you do not know how long you may remain in a good spiritual condition. Think that no one is weaker than yourself.  
 Happy is that person whom Truth itself teaches, not by figures of speech and eloquent language, but as Truth itself is. Our own opinions and understanding often lead us astray and offer us little true insight.

Pastoral Ponderings

This past Thursday morning, our candidates for First Holy Communion, plus their catechists and many parents and other family members went to the Perth Synagogue in Menora.  
**Rabbi Lieberman** gave a very engaging talk on the customs and practices of our Jewish neighbours. He was very impressed by the knowledge of our children, and said that this was the best student group he has ever had.  
 The highpoint was at the end, when Rabbi blew the long ram's horn called the shofar. It is blown on the Day of Atonement (Yom Kippur) and the Jewish New Year (Rosh Hashanah), and other high holy days.  
 The Jewish community deeply appreciates our parish's outreach, as we strive to love one another.

 As promised last weekend, here is the conclusion of our **youth ministry team's reflections** for all of us to consider:

Not all of our young people attend Catholic schools, so being around like-minded peers in the parish youth group is important in their faith formation.  
 Building a strong youth community is imperative to hosting a successful youth group, where young people will want to be with the friends they have made in their parish.  
 We recognise that there are many extra-curricular activities, both school and community based, which compete for our young people's attention.  
 Yet there is certainly a desire by some of our families that the parish should have a youth group, and they have been supportive.  
 We invite input from those families who have not sent their children to the parish youth group. Are you willing to commit to this endeavour? What do you want for your children's faith formation? Do your children attend a youth group elsewhere?  
 In sum: we are going 'back to the drawing board', and we are not shying away from re-thinking our approach, so that we can best serve our parish needs.
