



It was wonderful to see the 75 people who attended Theodore's recital this past Sunday afternoon. Of course, he sang brilliantly - all pieces that he will present in audition this year for operas & programs.

Thank you to the women of the parish who laid such an abundant table for the afternoon tea in the undercroft following the recital. This was actually our first social gathering in the undercroft since the Pandemic began! Theodore and his family were very touched by the obvious high esteem in which we all hold our Principal Cantor.

He'll return to Manchester on Thursday 15th September, and hopefully return to us to sing here for Christmas.
