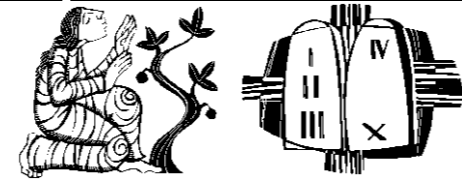

A Short Meditation
 from The Imitation of Christ

The more a person is at peace with himself and inwardly undivided, the more varied and profound things he can understand without effort, for he receives the light of understanding from above.

A pure, simple and steady spirit is not distracted by flitting about from one thing to another, for he does all things to the honour of God, and he tries in his heart to be free from all selfishness.

What gets in your way and troubles you more than the passions of your own heart? A good, devout person first arranges inwardly the things he must do outwardly. He does not let his passions get the best of him, but subjects them to sound judgment.

Pastoral Ponderings

Sometimes we forget that the Royal Family are truly a family. Like all of us, they have their good times and their bad, their joys and their sorrows, their individuals who are difficult and those who live only for the rest of the family.

I'm sure that you have watched and/or read at least some of the extensive coverage of these days leading up to The Queen's funeral, as well as the opening words and actions of her son's new reign.

For me, the ones to watch have been Princess Anne, the Princess Royal, and Sophie, Countess of Wessex. These two women stand apart from the fray of the constant harping, guessing and accusing that surrounds the 'stars' of the Royal Family: Charles & Camilla, William & Kate, Harry & Meagan, and of course Andrew. These latter ones get most of the coverage.

But Anne & Sophie have been happy to remain in the background - not only this past week, but indeed throughout the past decade or two. Yet they are the hardest working members of 'The Firm'. Each of these women does her best to listen, to encourage, to thank and to console. Each has family of her own: Sophie has two young ones to guide into the ways of family and royalty; and while Anne's two children are grown, she has surely grieved over the breakup of the marriage of her firstborn (and The Queen's first grandchild), Peter.

One of the many purposes of a royal family is not so much to set an example for the rest of us, but to serve as a 'living parable' about family life in our own time.

Jesus told parables about family: the Prodigal Son, of course, but also the householder who doesn't want to get out of bed to help his next-door neighbour, the woman sweeping her floor to find a lost drachma coin, and even today's parable about the crafter steward who is ripping off the family he is supposed to be serving.

The Royal Family has the silent, hard-working ones; the self-centred, always 'out there' ones, the unappreciated working ones, and the ones who simply want peace in the home. As we look at them, we tend to judge them; but do we ever see members of our own families in them? Do we ever learn?

All went well for me on Friday. I do feel much better, but the doctor wants me to rest - in bed or in a chair - and not to be busy, but to rest for a week.

And Theodore is back in the UK. He texts me a lot, and he, too, is 'family' for me. Thank you for being so supportive of him these past two months.
