



A Short Meditation from The Imitation of Christ by Thomas a Kempis (1379-1471)

All perfection in this earthly life has some accompanying imperfection. All of our wondering about life is not without some darkening mist. But a humble understanding of yourself is a surer way to God than a profound searching after some theological knowledge.

Now, there's nothing wrong with having knowledge, nor with trying to understand anything that is good in itself and made so by God. But a good conscience and a life of virtue are always to be put first.

Nevertheless, many people choose to seek knowledge rather than to live good lives. They are often led astray and their lives come to very little - or nothing at all.

Pastoral Ponderings

Thank you, dear parishioners, for your patience with me whilst I have taken the past seven days to rest and recover from my back surgery.

And a big thank you to Father Mariusz for so generously shouldering the entire burden of parish ministry (with a funeral thrown in for good measure!). But he was appointed here to learn how to be a good parish priest. It's good for him to have total responsibility once in a while. I'm sure he did ı good job.

Speaking of appointments, I had to laugh when I received this week a letter from the Archbishop appointing me to a **third term** as your parish priest The appointment was effective this past 8th February 2022 - more than seven months ago!

This is the way of bureaucracy: If I am even one or two weeks late in completing and returning one of the many forms and surveys I receive every month from the Archdiocese, someone gets on the horn and 'gently' reminds me to get my you-knowwhat in gear and send in the form, pronto!

But the powers-that-be can be more than seven months late in appointing me to an important role as your parish priest, and that's okay - because they are so busy. (I'm being cynical, I know, but this is always the story: do as I say, don't do as I do.)

In the end, however, the Archdiocese has great **confidence** in our parish, and in me. We would not have the responsibility of training a younger priest to take charge of a parish of his own in the near future if we were perceived to be a group of lacklustre Catholics led by an incompetent priest.

No, the Archdiocese consults me quite often about my views on the future of parish life, good liturgical celebration and Catholic education. They know we are a vibrant community, and we are planted firmly in the middle of parish practice: we don't have groups of dissidents, we don't foster practices and devotions that are not mainstream, and we strive to give the best **worship** that we can to Almighty God.

We strive to grow in our Faith, intellectually and spiritually, through bible study (another session will be announced soon!), RCIA, catechesis of our children by the priests, and annual parish retreats.

So thank you, everyone, for your kindness to me and Fr Mariusz, and for your loyal support. Oh yes, there are a few complainers here and there; but here's the fly in the ointment: the complainers are not active in parish life, nor loyal to our community. So I take their complaints with a grain of salt.

I'll be going home to the USA from 6th October to 2nd November. Fr Mariusz needs more practice!
