The Wisdom of the Saints: The Incarnation

Christ did not mystically pass through the body of the Virgin Mary as through a channel. No, He truly took our flesh, and He was truly fed with milk from her. He truly ate as we eat and drank as we drink. For if the Incarnation was a figment, then our salvation is a figment. - St Cyril of Jerusalem

A Short Meditation from The Imitation of Christ by Thomas à Kempis (1379-1471)

Don't take pride in your possessions, nor in your friends who may be powerful and influential. Instead, take pride in God, Who gives us all things, and Who wants above all to give us Himself.

Do not brag about the good condition or beauty of your body, which a little sickness can spoil and disfigure. Do not be overly pleased about your own abilities or talents, lest you displease God, from Whom comes the sum total of whatever good you have.

Don't think that you are better than other people, lest you appear worse in God's eyes. God knows what we are. Don't be proud of your good deeds, for God's judgements differ from ours, and He is often displeased by what pleases us.

Pastoral Ponderings

Another Advent begins! Although secular society has been pushing Christmas for some time now on television and in the shops, we will now focus on our spiritual celebration of Our Lord's coming:

- ♦ 2000 years ago in Bethlehem
- on the day of our own death
- and on the Last Day, when He comes again. The purple vestments and the lighting of the Advent wreath will mark our liturgies over these next weeks. Singing "O Come, O Come, Emmanuel" will be our expression of longing for Christ to come.

We badly need **Christ** to come to us. Our world, or course, is continually lurching from one crisis to another. If our leaders, instead of holding countless summit meetings, would simply call everyone to pray for peace, imagine what the result might be.

But, as we are reminded in The Imitation, overdependence on our own abilities and efforts while ignoring God is always counter-productive. During this Advent, let's all ask Jesus to pierce through our darkness and enlighten us with His peace.

Eleven of us priests gathered at Belmont Parish this past Thursday for our usual monthly meeting o prayer and discussion - and we also celebrated Thanksgiving Day, which we do annually. As always, I baked pumpkin pie and cornbread muffins. We priests constantly remember you, our people,

in our prayers. Please do the same for us.

However, we will wait (a while!) before restoring Communion from the common chalice. Likewise, we will postpone exchanging the Sign of Peace.

This year's <u>Lessons & Carols</u> service will be held on Sunday 11th December at 7.00pm, with a supper afterwards. Sister Kathy Kettle RSM, who is visiting us this weekend to speak to us about her work with Aid to the Church in Need, will also be our guest speaker at Lessons & Carols.. Please save the date, and invite your friends.

Father Mariusz has trained eight new altar servers and seven new acolytes. And he's our liaison with the City of Stirling as well as the Archdiocese about our building project and financial matters. So he needs a bit of rest, and will be on a well-earned break this week (back next weekend). Let's pray for him.
