

Ch. 13 (cont.): A person must be watchful when temptation begins, for then the Enemy is more easily overcome if he is not allowed to enter inside the mind's door, but he knocks.

It is for this reason that someone said, "Resist the beginning - the remedy comes too late!" Because first a simply thought comes to the mind, and then a vivid picture takes shape. Afterward comes delight, then a small giving in by the mind, and finally total acceptance. This is how, little by little, the evil Enemy gains full entrance if he is not resisted at the very beginning. And the longer you put off your resistance, the weaker you will become each day, and the stronger the Enemy will grow.

People tend to confuse the Annunciation (March 25th) and the Immaculate Conception (December 8th), The Immaculate Conception celebrates Mary being conceived through a normal act of sexual intimacy between her parents SS Joachim & Anne BUT, unlike us, she was conceived free from any stain of original sin: the Immaculate Conception.

If Mary had been stained by original sin - which plants selfishness and disobedience in the hearts of us all - she may have said 'No!' when the Angel Gabriel came to her on the day we celebrate this Saturday, March 25th: the Lord's Annunciation.

This Saturday, we will actually celebrate the Conception of <u>Iesus</u> in the womb of Mary. Needless to say, that Conception was also immaculate, since Our Lord is sinless. But we only use the term 'the is kept firmly outside the threshold while | Immaculate Conception' to refer to the beginning of Mary's human life in her mother's womb.

> For many centuries, when Europe was Christian, the civil new year began in March - and usually on March 25th! Ianuary 1st wasn't celebrated as New Year's Day - it was the Feast of the Circumcision of Jesus, on the eighth day of His human life.

> Until the late 1800s, American presidents were always inaugurated, not in January, but in March which then was the start of the civil year. Didn't know that, did you?

> It would be wonderful if you could come to church this Saturday, for Rosary at 9.35am and then Mass at 10.00am, to celebrate the start of our redemption when Jesus was conceived in the womb of Mary.

How long does a baby gestate inside the womb? Nine months. Hence Christmas - the Nativity of Our Lord - will be celebrated on December 25th nine months after the Annunciation.

Wait - only nine more months until Christmas? Time to start shopping!
