

As I write this, there are still many things for me to do before I leave on Friday afternoon for the annual parish retreat in New Norcia: music to prepare, PowerPoints to finalise, prayers of the faithful to write, directions for the visiting priests to compile, parish notices to organise - and this bulletin to get done so it can be photocopied and folded!

Sometimes I think it's not worth all the work involved in preparing to go away - it would be easier for me just to stay home. But the various tasks still need to be done, whether I stay or leave.

And, to tell you the truth, I really need this retreat weekend. There's something about going away, or as Our Lord advised His disciples, 'going apart to a lonely place', that helps me gain perspective on all that is happening in my life and in the life of the parish, the Archdiocese and the Universal Church.

It's also good to get together with a group of our parishioners for the weekend. The monks are always pleased to see us join them for prayers and Masses. And it's wonderful to listen to talks together, then share our various ideas and concerns. Sharing meals is also a highpoint for everyone.

Finally, just taking a walk in the countryside, or sitting in the courtyard, and having that quiet time for oneself is so important to maintain spiritual

Some of the retreatants this weekend are firsttimers, while others are 'repeat customers'. If you haven't come on retreat with us, try to make sure you do so the next time around!

I get into arguments with some of my brother priests who want good music in their parishes, as we have, but who aren't willing to pay musicians or singers.

They think organists and singers should volunteer their services. Of course, some of our parishioners do volunteer their services for free. But some of our singers have paid a lot of money to take lessons and study for degrees, and music is their livelihood.

In the US, the National Conference of Bishops has a policy about paying just wages for musicians and singers. The tariff is based upon level of education and years of experience. There is nothing like this in Australia. And, to me, that explains why the level of musical performance is so hit-and-miss in our parishes - many resort to playing CDs at Mass!

Archbishop Costelloe has told me that whenever he meets people from St Paul's, he asks them what draws them to our parish. He says the answer is always the same: "Strong preaching, and beautiful

Our music during Holy Week was a true joy. It lifted up my mind and heart to God, and I hope is did the same for you. Christ is truly risen: Alleluia!
