A Short Meditation from The Imitation of Christ by Thomas à Kempis (1379-1471)

Ch. 15: Never do what you know is wrong for anything in the world, or to please anyone. Yet, a good work may be put aside, or changed into a better work, in order to serve the needy.

Without love, good works are worthless; but with love, they become entirely rewarding, no matter how small or insignificant they may seem. Indeed, God places more importance on the reason you work than on how much work you actually do. Thank you to all of you who attended this past Monday's funeral for parishioner Esme McGroder When I began the Mass, I was a bit taken aback by all the people in the front who remained sitting, and didn't give the simplest responses (e.g., 'And with your spirit'); many of them didn't even make the Sign of the Cross.

But then I looked up and saw all of you standing, making the Sign of the Cross, and responding to the prayers. Thank you - I appreciated your attendance and your support.

A priest who doesn't get responses from his people feels like a comedian who doesn't get any laughs. The poor comedian goes on with his routine, but he becomes flustered, and he bombs out.

It's a flawed analogy, but believe me, it's not easy to stand up in front of a church full of people - even you! - and try to motivate people to respond, to sing, and even to listen. But you did well on Monday, and I'm grateful for your support.

This Sunday's Gospel is about sheep and the Good Shepherd. At Esme's funeral, I thought of another Gospel passage: the one about the Shepherd who separates the sheep from the goats.

It was amazing to see an invisible dividing line in the church, separating the participating Catholics from everyone else. The two groups were literally divided by a barrier that ran right across the church.

What bothered me was the fact that a good number of the people who couldn't be bothered to make the Sign of the Cross or say an Amen, and who had to be asked to stand for the Gospel, then trotted up to Holy Communion.

One of the purposes of our First Friday devotions is to atone for offences against the Eucharist. Our faithful and reverent participation in the Mass, and our humble approach to receiving Our Lord in the Blessed Sacrament, must become a witness to others. And we must pray for the conversion of those who can't be bothered to pray, much less to come to Holy Mass. As I've said before, invite someone to join you for Mass one weekend. You may be acting as God's instrument of salvation.

Today (Saturday) I commemorate 26 years since I arrived in Perth to begin my ministry in Australia. It has not been easy, but I have always looked upon it as a 'missionary venture' to spread the Gospel of Christ in this Great South Land of the Holy Spirit that, in many ways, is a desert land thirsting for spiritual renewal.

Our parish is an oasis in this desert. Your good participation in the liturgy helps draw in people who are thirsting for the living God. Goodonya!
