A Short Meditation from The Imitation of Christ by Thomas à Kempis (1379-1471)

Pastoral Ponderings

It's 11.15pm on Good Friday as I begin this column. Three beautiful services - Stations of the Cross, the Solemn Liturgy of the Passion, and the Seven Last Words. We had wonderful attendance at each of the services, and I commend you for your participation and devotion.

Following the Seven Last Words service at 7.30pm, Father Mariusz, Alessio and I went out to Rifo's for a light dinner. I just needed to get away! It's been a bit of a stressful week for me, due to our losing power (and internet) in the Presbytery for all of Tuesday and part of Wednesday. I couldn't type or photocopy anything, so I got 'way behind in my work of preparing homilies, prayers, PowerPoints and music. I was on tenterhooks!

And then I was struggling to catch up on my work as Holy Thursday dawned. We had a wonderful celebration with our school students that morning: Stations of the Cross and Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament. I was so proud of our children as they sang and prayed so well. There probably isn't another school in Perth where the children know the hymns for Benediction and can pray the Divine Praises so confidently.

Father Mariusz did so well this week! He had to take on the role of celebrant of most liturgies (including washing feet!) since I was directing our wonderful parish choir. Father has a very good way of organising everything for the liturgy so well; I don't worry about a thing when he's in charge.

Although directing the choir takes me away from the altar, and I do feel guilty about that, I also know that good liturgical music is also an important part of our worship experience. It lifts up our hearts and helps to focus our minds on the sacred mysteries that are being celebrated. And so many of you thanked me for the music, so I know you appreciate it.

At the Easter Vigil we baptised two fine young men, Zak Kirkup and Stephen Chen. They have faithfully attended Mass here for the past two years, led to St Paul's by parishioner Nathan Hondros. When Zak was running for Premier, Nathan was his campaign manager and Stephen worked on staff. This is a wonderful example of how laymen working in the world can give witness to the Faith and bring others to know Christ.

And I admire Zak and Stephen for persevering through two years of RCIA classes and Sunday Masses. In an age when many Catholic adults have simply abandoned the faith of their fathers and mothers, Zak and Stephen have voluntarily - and very joyfully - embraced it. May their example be a reminder to us all about how precious our Catholic faith really is. We celebrate it well here at St Paul's, and I'm sure God has been glorified this Holy Week.
