

A Short Meditation from The Imitation of Christ by Thomas à Kempis (1379-1471)

From Book 4, The Book of the Sacrament: O admirable and hidden grace of this Sacrament, which only Christ's faithful ones can know! Those who lack faith, those who are slaves of sin, cannot experience such grace.

In this Sacrament spiritual grace is given, the soul's lost strength is restored, and its beauty, often disfigured by sin, returns.

Sometimes this grace is so great that, through the fullness of the devotion offered to God, not only the mind, but the weakened body as well, feels an increase in

If Holy Mass were to be celebrated in only one place in the world, don't you think people would want to go to that place? But Christ is offered up here in our own church! He says, "Come to Me!"

Pastoral Ponderings

Yet another interest rate rise! I realise that this is a necessary way of battling inflation, but it certainly makes it very difficult for us to contemplate taking on a mortgage if we are to build our new parish centre and presbytery. Our monthly payments would be unmanageable.

And we're all trying to cope with rising costs of living. I want to thank you again for your sacrificial giving to the parish - you are very generous with your support.

Nevertheless, we are always 'juggling the books' to pay our bills. It's difficult. Somehow we make it.

Someone suggested that we not have an organist and cantor at our Saturday 6pm Masses in order to save some money. I rejected that suggestion outright, for these reasons:

- Our first purpose as a parish is to offer worship to Almighty God; all else is secondary.
- The liturgy (as the Second Vatican Council says) is the 'source and summit of our life'.
- Being so, we should give our very best to God.
- We've already cut liturgical costs recently by not having live flowers every weekend, but only for special feasts; meanwhile, we're using silk flower arrangements for most weekends.
- I don't want the Saturday 6pm Mass to be the 'poor Mass' - i.e., no music 'to save money'.
- Many parishes don't want to pay organists or cantors because 'it's too expensive', and they play CDs instead. I find that deplorable.
- Good music is one of the hallmarks of St Paul's parish, and I want to keep it that way.

The Catholics of Europe in the Middle Ages built magnificent cathedrals and churches in nearly every city, town and village. Stonework, stained glass windows, mosaic flooring, marble columns, grand pipe organs, gorgeous paintings and frescoes, finelycarved statues, precious chalices, magnificent silken vestments - "Only the best for God!" was their cry.

Rich and poor alike made sacrifices to beautify the churches. Women donated their wedding rings to be melted down and made into chalices. Working men donated their labour in summer evenings and on Saturdays to erect lofty church walls and spires, with only wooden scaffolding and basic equipment.

Everything was a labour of love for the Lord, and a living act of faith in the Eucharist that would be offered daily in their churches. Their testimony of faith stands even today throughout Europe.

And, to top it all off, they composed some of the most beautiful music in the world to be sung at Mass. Let's continue in that tradition of faith!
