

A Short Meditation from The Imitation of Christ by Thomas à Kempis (1379-1471)

Book 19 (cont.): We should always have some definite plan in mind for our spiritual growth, especially to counter those things which most often stand in our way. We must examine our outward and inward affairs and set both in order, because both are necessary for our spiritual progress.

Try to have some moments for inner peace at least once a day, particularly in the morning or evening. In the morning, make your plans for the day. In the evening, go over your conduct, reviewing how you behaved this day in word, thought and deed, to see whether you have pleased or displeased God or your neighbour.

Pastoral Ponderings

This weekend's excerpt from The Imitation of Christ recommends having some moments each day that are dedicated to finding 'inner peace'.

As I've mentioned on several occasions, our prayer need not always be 'reciting' or 'reading' prayer that have been composed by others. These prayers are certainly good - but only as a starting point.

It's good if we can 'say' some prayers, and then sit back, take a deep breath, and just relax - or, as the Bible tells us, "Rest in the Lord." These moments of quiet are when we can begin to achieve 'inner peace'.

Thomas à Kempis, like all good spiritual directors, recommends seeking these moments of quiet in the morning and/or the evening.

I tell the school children to pray at night like this:

- ♦ THANK YOU, Lord, for the good things that have happened, or that I was able to do, today.
- SORRY, Lord, for the wrong things I said or did, or the good things I failed to do, today.
- HELP ME, Lord, with the special tasks/events that lie before me tomorrow.

Thank You - Sorry - Help me: it's a simple outline of an examination of conscience that all of us could benefit from making each night before we go to sleep.

A few weekends ago, I spoke about the benefit of using holy water and making the Sign of the Cross at the start and the end of each day. We gave out 100 bottles of holy water! I hope you're using them.

Morning and/or night prayer each day is another good help to our spiritual growth. Simply making ourselves aware of God's presence each day is so very important in maintaining the life of grace in our souls. It's good to remind ourselves that we have been chosen by God to be His special people, and that He has entrusted to us a mission of telling others about Him - not only by our words, but also by our actions and our attitudes.

Having a regular daily regimen of prayer, however brief and simple, is just as important for spiritual growth as eating and drinking on a regular basis is essential for our physical growth.

Father Mariusz was recently elected WA Chairman of the Australian Confraternity of Catholic Clergy congratulations! In this capacity, he will be away this week for the Annual Conference and AGM, being held in Albury from Monday through Friday.

I was State Chairman about 20 years ago, and organised the first (and only) time the Conference was held in WA, at Safety Bay. It was an eyeopener for the priests from the Eastern States to visit Perth, New Norcia and the beautiful WA coast - for most of them the first time they visited our State.
