

I know I've said this many times before, but it is so consoling to me to see how these young children are so reverent at Mass, how well they listen to the Word of God being read and preached, and with what devotion they receive Holy Communion.

At the conclusion of this particular Mass, I blessed the Brown Scapulars and then I, Father Mariusz and several teachers invested the children with their Scapulars, as a sign of Our Lady's protective love

Thank you to the parents and grandparents who joined us. I hope you were as edified as I was.

Of course, this reverence and devotion are nurtured by having Mass nearly every Thursday morning for the Year 4, 5 and 6 students. Because they 'know the drill' and participate well in the Mass, they set good example for the younger ones to imitate.

Any good habit or attitude can only be inculcated in a person through regular practice. Sadly, many of our Catholic schools have Mass only once a term or perhaps twice. But then, because they forget what to say and do from Mass to Mass, each time they go it's a matter of 'returning to Square One'.

Good parents & good teachers know that repetition builds expertise and also confidence in children, and when they are confident about what they are doing, they can enjoy it more and gain more from it.

I wish you could see the beautiful looks of devotion and piety on the faces of so man of our children as they receive Jesus in Holy Communion - and, this past Thursday - as they were clothed in Our Lady's Brown Scapular.
