



## Pastoral Ponderings

I enjoy reading the quarterly newsletter The Brag from **Campion College** in New South Wales.

Campion is a small tertiary institution providing a liberal arts education for Catholic students since 2006. It is named for the 16th century English martur St Edmund Campion.

This past October, President Katalin Novak of Hungary addressed the students about her country's unique pro-family policies, and the importance of faith in public and personal life.

She said that in 2010, her country had the EU's lowest fertility rate - just 1.2 children per couple. So her Government introduced a new policy: Hungary now spends 6% of its GDP on family welfare policies - more than twice as much as defence.

The more children a woman has, the less tax she pays. And if she has at least four children, she will never again pay personal income tax - ever!

Higher education loans are also reduced after each successive child, and totally written off for a family with at least three children.

Housing subsidies, mortgage reductions, personal loans & other financial benefits tied to childbearing are also widely available.

She warned the students against postponing their family in favour of career. She is now 46, but sees herself first as a wife, mother and daughter.
