A Short Meditation from The Imitation of Christ by Thomas à Kempis (1379-1471)

Chap 24 (cont.): Truly, we are deceiving ourselves if we become too self-confident. What other fuel does the fire have, except your sins? The more lax you are now, and the more you focus on exaggerating your own self-importance, the more severely will you pay for it later on - and the more fuel will you be gathering for the fire!

In whatever ways you have sinned, in those same ways you will be severely punished. In Hell, lazy will be pushed with burning prods, while gluttons will suffer great hunger and thirst. Lovers of luxury and pleasure will be drenched in burning tar and stinking brimstone, and the envious will howl their anguish like mad dogs.

In Hell, each vice will be punished with its own special torment. The proud will be utterly confused, while the miserly will be in terrible need.

Pastoral Ponderings

Given today's excerpt from The Imitation of Christ (middle column) is a bit scary (but true), I thought I'd balance it a bit with some positive thoughts from The Wisdom of the Saints (box above).

I especially like the last observation, made by Blessed Theophane Venard. Like him, we live in an increasingly godless society. Yet, like him, we enion the quiet witness of good young Catholics who are striving to live their faith in tangible ways.

We are proud of our thirty-five altar servers who assist at our liturgies so reverently. But unless you come to weekday Mass, you're probably not aware that several of our Year 10, 11 and 12 teens pop in and volunteer to serve.

That is a special joy for me, and it reminds me of myself at that age. I didn't just serve when I was rostered on the weekends - no, I truly loved serving, and I served almost daily.

So who was Blessed Theophane Venard? He was born in France in 1829, one of six children. As a boy he read of the marturdom of 29-yr-old Iean-Charles Cornay in Vietnam, and he was inspired to become a missionary priest himself.

He was originally sent to Hong Kong in 1853, but a change of plans found him sent to Vietnam. He had to hide out in the mountains and minister to people mostly at night. He was captured in 1860 and held in a cage for two months. He refused to trample on a crucifix, and was beheaded in 1861 on 2 February, the feast of the Presentation of the Child Jesus in the Temple. He was just 31.

myself was raised on reading the lives of the Saints. The stories of their idealism and heroism made me want to imitate them. Indeed, I became a priest. And I was called to leave my homeland and journey to the ends of the earth to minister to God's people - alas, not in mountainous jungles, but in the concrete jungles of Perth and Sydney.

And I labour for Christ - not amid those who hate Him and murder His priests, but worse: I, like you, am surrounded by apathy - Catholics who just don't care, who can't be bothered to make an effort to join us at Holy Mass, even once in a while, to show love for Him Who loved us, even unto death.

Bl Theophane and St Jean-Charles imitated Jesus in a bloody death. My own dying with Christ has been taking much longer than theirs! And it hasn't been bloody, but our godless society makes martyrdom by apathy painful nonetheless.

But seeing our young people who serve or read at Mass, and those who will sing or play their stringed instruments for us at Christmas, tells me that all is not lost. Christ still calls, and the young respond.
