



# Pastoral Ponderings

It's been a short **Advent** - the usual four weeks have been abruptly cut off, because today is both the Fourth (and last) Sunday of Advent AND Sunday is also Christmas Eve. Just three weeks of Advent!

And so Christmas has 'snuck up on us' - and here we are! Thank you to those intrepid parishioners who came to church last Sunday afternoon to drag out the Christmas decorations from the shed, set up and arrange the Nativity scene so lovingly, put up the trees and garland, lights and candles and bows, so that we have a beautiful setting in which to pray during the Christmas season.

Most of those parishioners went home, grabbed a bite to eat, changed clothes, and then returned that same evening for Lessons & Carols at 7.00pm.

This was our 15th annual L&C, and it just seems to get better each year. The choir was magnificent, supported by our strings group and trumpeter, with ever-faithful Alessio at the organ.

The readers represented a cross-section of our local community - St Paul's, Ordinariate, city and state. Our own **Zak Kirkup** gave a moving account of his journey to the Catholic Church via our parish noticed that all the young people in the choir were hanging on his every word. He spoke about how he had plans for his life, and he achieved those plans but then everything fell apart.

It was at that very moment of collapse that Zak came to St Paul's, joined our RCIA program, was baptised (at a time when most adults want little or nothing to do with Church or even God Himself) and now Zak reads at Mass, helps with IT, and is a member of our parish Finance Committee.

We like to say that "God works in mysterious ways." Indeed, Zak gave us a good witness of how wonderfully God can come to our rescue when we think all is lost.

At every Christmas, we remember this: God came to our rescue when it seemed all was lost. Rome had conquered the Western world - Rome, with all of its grandeur, literature & architecture, its technology, its legal system - all of which we still use today.

But it was also Rome with its pagan culture that had little or no sense of personal morality, no system of helping the poor and the sick, no qualms about killing unwanted children, no awareness of the deep despair of its millions of slaves (a huge portion of the population of the time!).

And it was **Rome**, with no hope of life after death only 'eat, drink, and be merry today - for tomorrow we die.' This Rome needed to be saved from itself.

And then, in the days of Caesar Augustus of Rome, Joseph and Mary made their way to Bethlehem . .
