Pastoral Ponderings

I did quite a bit of preparation for last weekend's Flame Ministries Congress. After all, I had been given two 70-minute timeslots for presentations. plus a Sunday Mass and homily. (I had been asked to give a third talk, but I baulked at that because I had originally been asked to give only one talk, and then my involvement was suddenly growing exponentially!)

The Archbishop spoke on Friday evening, and then I spoke on Saturday morning and Sunday evening, along with Mass on Sunday morning.

I had spoken at a Flame Congress about 20 years ago, and there were hundreds of people attending. Last weekend: 17 for my first talk, 30 for Mass, and about the same for the evening 'rally'. Talk about being underwhelmed!

I had to quickly adapt my style: there's a world of difference between speaking to a large room full of people, and speaking to 17 people scattered around a large room!

So I pulled up a chair, sat down, and - following my prepared talks as a guide - I spoke very simply to the people. After about an hour of that each time, opened up for 20 minutes or so of questions.

The people were very appreciative, and I'm glad I was able to be with them to guide and encourage them. I had a chance to speak with the leaders, and gave them some suggestions for building up the group in the future.
