Chap 25 (cont.): There is one thing that keeps many people from gaining ground and from fervently striving to improve: the dread of difficulty, or - more accurately the effort of the struggle.

The people who progress most in virtue truly, the ones who progress beyond all others - are those who make a valiant effort to overcome the things that are the most troublesome to them, that work most against them.

A person makes more progress and deserves fuller grace in those instances where he overcomes such obstacles completely and where he cleanses his spirit by doing so. But not everyone has the same amount to overcome and cleanse.

Time seems to rush by faster and faster. Each month is packed with activities and events, and just manage to catch my breath at the end of one week, thinking to myself, "Well, I made it through that week" - when the next week is even busier!

We just finished the Christmas season, and have hardly dented Ordinary Time (this is Week 4), when the teachers are returning to school this week, to be followed by the students next week.

Soon we'll be starting **Lent** on Ash Wednesday, 14th February (which will cause a lot of angst for those who plan on having a nice St Valentine's Day steak dinner . . . but it will be a day of fast and abstinence. Ha! So if I were you, I'd plan my outing for the night before, which is Shrove Tuesday. You be spared the Valentine's Day price hike in restaurants.

Back to the topic of school: this past Thursday, Fi Mariusz and I joined two of our veteran teachers for a meeting with our new principal Nicola Lee and our new assistant principal Leanne Fanetti. It was a 2-hour meeting, but very profitable and enjoyable.

Nicola and Leanne are both faith-filled women, and completely supportive of our efforts to instill the Catholic faith in our children through:

- class prayer services on Tuesdays
- student Masses on Thursdays
- catechism lessons on Fridays
- hymn singing every other Friday
- confessions four times per year
- Rosary, Stations, Benediction, conferral of the Scapular - the traditional Catholic devotions

This Monday morning I'll meet with the entire staff to give presentations on St Paul (his life, mission and message), preparing prayer services and Masses, and an overview of the liturgical year.

Then, Fr Mariusz will offer Mass, but instead of a homily, I'll speak at several strategic moments to explain why the priest says or does various things It's an 'instructional Mass', and I've always had very good feedback on this afterwards.

So please keep me, Fr Mariusz and our school staff in your prayers. We have a wonderful school, but it takes a lot of extra effort to make it a Catholic school.

Friday's feast of the Presentation of the Lord is one of the most beautiful in the church year. It begins with the Blessing of Candles near the main door of the church, then a procession with lighted candles to the altar, followed by Mass. The feast recalls when Mary and Joseph presented Jesus in the Temple on the fortieth day after His Birth, and Simeon hailed Him as 'a Light of revelation to the nations'. Join us!
