

Chap 25 (cont.): Place before you the image of the Crucified. When you look into the life of Jesus Christ, you may well be ashamed that you have not tried harder to be like Him, even though you have been following Him for a long time.

A person who trains himself intently and devoutly in the holy life and Passion of the Lord will find everything he needs, and in abundance. You need not look beyond Jesus for anything better. If the Crucified Jesus were to enter our hearts, how quickly and fully would we be taught!

A religious person accepts all things and bears them well, whatever they may be But a lukewarm person has trouble on top of trouble, and endures anguish from every side, because he lacks inner peace and cannot find it anywhere else he may look.

# Pastoral Ponderings

St John Bosco had gathered many children who were abandoned on the streets of Turin, Italy, and he asked his mother, Margarita, to help him care for them. It was a difficult task for Margarita to be a mother to this new-found, very large family cooking, cleaning, washing clothes and so on.

One day she just couldn't do it anymore, and she said to her son: "I'm exhausted. The children break everything. I can't keep them still. I quit. Find someone else to take care of them!"

Don Bosco remained silent. He knew how much she was doing for them, working practically around the clock. So he pulled a crucifix from his pocket and held it before his mother's eyes. She took a long look at Jesus on the Cross, understood the message and ended up saying: "All right - I'll stay!"

Last weekend I asked you if you have a crucifix in your **home**. I suggested that instead of keeping it in the bedroom, you display it in a more public place like the entry or the lounge room. There it will proclaim, "This is a Catholic home." But it will also be more evident to you.

Lent is that season when we take a long look at Jesus on the Cross. We join Him in fasting, praying and giving alms to the poor. Let's not give up - let's have a Lent that is **challenging**, but fantastic!

Here are some wise words of Pope Francis:

#### Do You Want to Fast This Lent?

- Fast from hurtful words; instead, say kind words.
- Fast from sadness; instead, be filled with gratitude.
- Fast from anger; instead, be filled with patience.
- Fast from pessimism; instead, be filled with hope.
- Fast from complaints; instead, be satisfied. - Fast from pressures; instead, spend time in prayer
- Fast from bitterness; instead, be filled with joy.
- Fast from selfishness; instead, think of others.
- Fast from grudges; instead, forgive and reconcile.
- Fast from many words; instead, be still & listen.

So what is your personal program of renewal this Lent? How will you put into practice Our Lord's

advice to pray, fast and give alms? The parish offers several Lenten activities; details are listed in this newsletter. Choose something to help you unite yourself to Christ on the Cross.
