Chap 25 (cont.): If you think someone language or behaviour is disgusting, then be careful that you do not say or do the same thing! And if you do, then correct yourself quickly. Remember: just as you're watching others, in the same way they're watching you!

It is joyful and sweet to see fervent and devout friends who get along agreeably and are self-controlled in their behaviour. But how sad it is - and what a burden! - to see people stumbling along in confusion, not living up to their Christian calling.

And how harmful it is for those same people to neglect the purpose of their baptismal calling, and instead focus their attention on affairs that should be none of their concern.

Remember what you set out to do, and place before you the image of the Crucified.

Pastoral Ponderings

First, let me address a crisis which is facing some of our more romantic parishioners: St Valentine's Day falls on Ash Wednesday this year - what to do?

Well, the obligation of fast and abstinence on Ash Wednesday is a serious one for Catholics (see the Lenten Regulations in the first column). So please do not dismiss this Lenten obligation lightly.

My advice is this: if you are planning a romantic dinner on St Valentine's Day, then let that be your main meal of the day, AND make sure it is meatless. You can have one or two small snacks earlier in the day to sustain your strength as necessary.

Alternatively, go out for your romantic dinner on the previous Tuesday - Shrove Tuesday (Mardi Gras - Fat Tuesday), which has always been a day for feasting before the Lenten fast begins. You can eat meat to your heart's delight on Shrove Tuesday.

And remember this: the restaurants hike up their prices on St Valentine's Day! So save some money go out on Shrove Tuesday or on Thursday evening.

This coincidence of St Valentine's Day and Ash Wednesday is an opportunity for some of you to

make a small sacrifice. Check out the box above, with the reflections of some of the Saints on the concept of sacrifice.

'Sacrifice' in Latin actually means 'make sacred', it doesn't mean giving things up. Yet we don't become holy people by indulging ourselves, always putting ourselves first.

No, we become holy by following Jesus' advice: love God, love our neighbour, love ourselves - in that order. And this kind of love often requires some sacrifice, doesn't it?

As you read this in church, you have made a small sacrifice of time to be at Mass. We call Mass 'the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass' precisely because it sets before us, over and over again, the once-for-all yet ongoing Sacrifice of Our Lord on the Cross.

Lent begins on Ash Wednesday: what sacrifices will we make to follow Jesus' three-part program of spiritual renewal - prayer, fasting and almsgiving?

Check out the various activities the parish offers this Lent, and choose one or more of them to assist you in growing spiritually this Lent. Unite yourself to Christ in His Sacrificial death for the world.

Today, at the end of our reflection from his <u>Imitation</u> of Christ, Thomas à Kempis reminds us to place before ourselves the image of the Crucified.

Do you have a crucifix in your home? If so, is it in a place where it is noticeable? Or is it in a place that is obscure and neglected?

If, by chance, you do not have a crucifix in your home, then make it your Lenten resolution to get one. Have it blessed by a priest. Put it somewhere in your home where it gives witness to all who see it.
