It was so good to get together and have a chance to chat (and enjoy good food and drink). I had a nice glass of wine, to reward myself after conducting the music at our Masses - and to fortify myself for my 5.00pm Latin Mass at St Anne's!

All the details haven't yet been finalised, but I do know this: our dear **Father Mariusz** is staying with us, thanks be to God! (So you can stop praying about that petition!)

But there are other things we continue to pray for: some movement on our Parish Building Project, joy and peace in our homes, and healing & strength for the sick and elderly.

That last petition is one that applies to me, too. was going to have my annual injections in my lower spine, left hip and left shoulder this coming August.

But my pain surgeon suddenly rang me this past Wednesday and said, "Father Tim, I know you are going to be very busy for Holy Week, and I wonder if you should have your injections early?"

You see: St Joseph was watching over me, because one of my petitions for the Novena was to gain a bit of relief from pain; it's been especially severe the past few weeks. So on Friday just past I went to SJOG Subiaco, was put under and had my injections.

It's appropriate that I chose 'Suffering' as the topic for the 'Wisdom of the Saints' box above. As St John Vianney advises, I am asking God for the grace to love my crosses. It's not easy, but then I think to myself: many people suffer far more than I do. So I am truly grateful that my crosses are small ones, and that I can at least still function as your priest. As my Mum would say, "God never gives us a cross without also giving us the grace to carry it."
