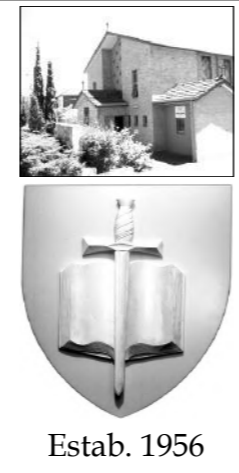

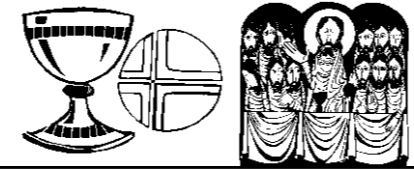

**The Wisdom of the Saints: The Holy Eucharist**

A Short Meditation  
 from The Imitation of Christ  
 by Thomas à Kempis (1379-1471)

**Bk 2, Ch 3 (concl.):** It is no great thing to associate with good and gentle people, for this naturally pleases all of us - everyone prefers to live in peace, and everyone likes those who think as he does.

But to be able to live peacefully with the harsh & wrong-headed or with the unruly or contrary, is a great grace and a most praiseworthy and virtuous achievement.

There are some people who are peaceful themselves and who also enjoy peace with others. There are some who neither have peace themselves nor who leave others in peace. And there are still others who are peaceful themselves and who try to guide others back to peace.

Yet all the peace we have in this life must be rooted more in humble perseverance than in a lack of difficulties. The person who knows best how to go on patiently will remain at peace better than others. Such a person is a conqueror of self, a friend of Christ, and heir to Heaven.

**Pastoral Ponderings**

*Today and this week we enjoy an abundance of great feasts, and graces in overflowing measure:*

- ♦ Corpus Christi
- ♦ The Sacred Heart of Jesus (Friday)
- ♦ The Immaculate Heart of Mary (Saturday)

*Let's open our hearts wide in anticipation of what God wants to give us this week: His grace, His spiritual energy, His own power to do good, His ability to conquer sin, His own life and His love!*

*How I wish we had been able to build our new church and parish centre. We could have held a most beautiful procession with the **Most Blessed Sacrament** around the landscaped grounds, ending with Benediction. Unfortunately, the trifecta of the pandemic, outrageous interest rates and a lack of construction companies and tradies in Perth worked against us. This is a huge disappointment for me, but in the end God will show the parish the way to provide for our ever-growing community.*

*Let this be one of our intentions today as we kneel before our Eucharistic Lord and honour Him with our prayers, our songs, our incense, and our love.*

*Let us ask Him to give us the **patience** to wait for the right moment when we can move forward and build. Let us beg Him to move our hearts to greater **generosity**, so that our Building Fund can increase to the point that - whenever we are allowed to begin our project - we will have enough money to pay the architect and engineers, and to make our monthly payments on the loan we will take out, so that we can move ahead with confidence at that future time.*

*But for now - today - let us thank Our Lord for His Gift of the **Eucharist**. Let us hide ourselves in His Sacred Heart. Let us find comfort in the Immaculate Heart of Mary. That is enough for now.*
