



A Short Meditation from The Imitation of Christ by Thomas à Kempis (1379-1471)

Bk 2, Ch 4: Two wings lift a person up from earthly concerns: simplicity and purity. Simplicity should be in intention, purity in feelings. Simplicity reaches out after God, purity catches hold and tastes.

If your heart is free from turmoil and conflict, everything you do will be for the best. If you seek only the will of God and the good of your neighbour - and if you act accordingly - you will enjoy true freedom.

If your heart were right, then everything in God's creation would be a mirror of life and a book of holy teachings. There is no creature so small and worthless that does not reflect God's goodness.

If you were inwardly good and pure then you would see and understand all things without difficulty. A pure heart penetrates both Heaven and Hell.

A person's judgment reflects his inner state. If there is joy in the world, surely the person with a pure heart has it, and if there is trouble and anguish anywhere, the one with a bad conscience knows this best.

Pastoral Ponderings

We confirmed eighteen of our young people this past Friday evening. There should have been nineteen, but one boy came down with COVID, and with him all his family. That boy couldn't be confirmed - he'll have to be confirmed separately in the near future.

This is yet another reminder that we're not out of the woods with regard to COVID. Yes, I know - it's like the flu now, and we have to learn to live with it. True: but most of you get a flu vaccination, right? So how many of you have updated your COVID jabs this year?

COVID seems to easily afflict our school children; nearly every week there's someone absent from school due to this virus. The children get over it pretty quickly - although not before they've passed it on to some of their classmates and family members!

We do have many children attending Mass in the parish - thanks be to God! But one of my concerns is how easy it is for them to pass on COVID to the older folks - and we do have a good number of parishioners in their 80s and 90s still coming to Mass - again, thanks be to God!

I have to do my best to ensure that COVID does not spread amongst you when you're here in church. Remember how I told you some time ago that a study shows that incense impedes the spread of COVID? That probably goes for the flu as well. So we have actually done quite well, having large groups at Mass without more serious consequences. (Just breathe in deeply during the incensations!)

In any case, I find it odd that some people want to restore the individual Sign of Peace at Mass - but don't want to restore Communion from the common Cup! It's a mystery to me. Is COVID done, or not?

The pandemic was a significant event in the life of the parish, but we weathered it well - our Mass livestreams continue every Saturday evening, and some still take advantage of this. You're welcome!
