
The Wisdom of the Saints: Trials

A Short Meditation from The Imitation of Christ

by Thomas à Kempis (1379-1471)

Bk 2, Ch 5/6 Consider it hollow comfort whatever comes from anything else but God. The souls that loves God sets little value on anything less than God. God alone, eternal, and measureless, fills all. He is the soul's comfort and joy.

A good conscience is the best thing a person can have. Have a good conscience and you will always have joy. A good conscience can bear many things, and it is always joyful in the midst of troubles; a bad conscience is always fearful and uneasy. You may rest easily if your heart does not reproach you. Never be happy unless you have done your best.

Those who bad things never have true joy, nor do they know inner peace, because, "there is no peace for wicked" says the Lord. And of they should say, "we are at peace, nothing and will happen to us; who dill dare to harm us," do not believe them, for God's anger will suddenly rise up, what they do will come to nothing, and all their plans will come crashing down.

Pastoral Ponderings

The Church gives us so many things to think about, as if trying to say our prayers faithfully, getting to Mass on Sunday and being a faithful and authentic Christian witness wasn't enough to think about! Did you know that we can contemplate certain 'themes' each calendar month? Traditionally, each month of the liturgical year is dedicated to some mystery of the faith or special saint. For example, January, is dedicated to the Holy Name of Jesus; February, the Passion; March, St. Joseph; April, the Resurrection; May, the Blessed Virgin; June, the Sacred Heart; July, the Precious Blood; August, the Assumption; September, the Holy Cross; October, the Rosary; November, the Poor Souls; December, Advent, or the Coming of Christ.

As you can see from the above list, in July we contemplate Jesus' Precious Blood. I'm sure that it is not something that comes to the forefront of our mind on a typical day. But the Precious Blood of Jesus is made present everyday - at every Mass! At the moment of Consecration we hear the priest pronounce the words of Jesus at the Last Supper: THIS IS THE CHALICE OF MY BLOOD. THE BLOOD OF THE NEW AND ETERNAL COVENANT, WHICH WILL BE POURED OUT FOR YOU, AND FOR MANY, THE FORGIVENESS OF SINS. The priest does this holding the chalice, and leaning forward slightly over the chalice - because through the deliberate and clear pronouncement of the words the wine becomes Jesus' Precious Blood.

How do we know that the wine becomes the Precious Blood of Jesus? Well, a miracle took place in the 8th century in Lanciano, Italy. A monk of the order of St. Basil assigned to that church had doubts about the Real Presence of Jesus' Body and Blood in the Eucharist. One day at the moment of Consecration as he was celebrating Mass, the host transformed into human flesh and the wine into fresh blood. To this day the host has been preciously conserved, along with the blood, which eventually coagulated. Both are exposed for adoration every year at Easter. A scientific analysis in 1971 revealed that the host is indeed human flesh, from the myocardium, that is, from the heart, and the heart of one who is alive! The coagulated blood is of the AB blood type, also with the properties of blood from a living person. To this day we can venerate this miraculous host and the five discs of coagulated blood.

So while some are thinking about getting their taxes done quickly in July with the hope of getting a refund, others about 'Dry July' if they've had an indulgent year, the Church focuses our minds on the saving act of Jesus on the Cross, and the miracle which occurs and each and every Mass, every day throughout the whole world – Jesus' Precious Blood made present.
